This Month's topic: "Competition: No Stress Excitement" by your Loose Nut.

"Who are we competing against"? The easy answer is: "All the other cars in my class or group". I proclaim that answer is wrong!

What is the right answer? We are competing against ourselves. Yeah, yeah – here comes some mushy, we are the luckiest people on the planet article to follow. I hope not! OK, maybe a little. You be the judge.

The greatest racing I remember is driving super closely with your friends lap after lap. At the end of the race, it does not matter who won. Everyone gets together and laughs about it. It does not get any better than that.

"Motor racing is like one big family, ultimately, and when you come back to it, that's really what it feels like."

"I look at myself as the luckiest man alive."

I conclude we compete against ourselves more than anyone else. We challenge ourselves to improve, push ourselves to drive better and achieve things that we previously thought were impossible for us.

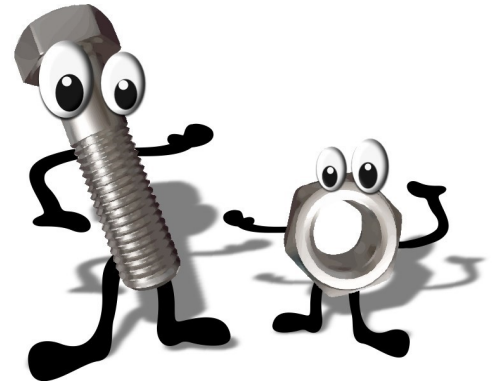
"I am confident Mario gets it!" Captain Obvious.

I try to always remember why I race and I hope you can also: It is a challenge to do well. It is exciting. There is an element of [good] fear. We constantly learn things and improve. Jettison any self-induced stress and enjoy it!
