Voting will take place at the next General Meeting on May 12, 2018. Members are strongly encouraged to come to the meeting to provide input and to vote.

December 1 of the prior year.

- C. Honorary. No dues or initiation fee. Recipient shall receive honorary membership card.
- D. Lifetime. No annual dues for the lifetime of the member. Recipient shall receive lifetime membership card.
- E. Payment of Dues. Annual dues shall be payable on January 1st of each year. Renewal Membership shall automatically lapse for non-payment of dues as of February 1.
- F. After determination of the annual dues amount for the coming calendar year by the Board of Directors, the Membership Chairperson shall prepare an annual dues <u>statement</u> to be paid by active members via Motorsportreg.com by January 1. The Membership Chairperson shall also send a dues statement to any member who has requested not to use Motorsportreg.com.

#### Section 5. EXPULSION AND RESIGNATION:

- A. Any member may be expelled for infraction of club rules or such causes contrary to the best interest of the club by majority vote of the Board of Directors. However, before such action is taken, the member shall have an opportunity to submit in writing or in person to the Board of Directors, his/her position, within 30 days, on any charge of which he/she shall be notified, and shall have the right to appeal to the membership.
- B. Resignation. Any member may resign by directing a letter of resignation to the Secretary. His/her resignation shall be effective on receipt. Any indebtedness to the club shall be paid at the time of his/her resignation.

#### Section 6. VOTING PRIVILEGES:

- A. Honorary members shall not have the right to be a board member or to vote.
- B. Each INDIVIDUAL active member and each member of a HOUSEHOLD shall have one vote.
- C. Each lifetime member shall have one vote.

#### ARTICLE III CLUB MEETINGS

The Cascade Sports Car Club shall hold one General meeting on the first Saturday of each month except when in conjunction with the annual picnic or otherwise announced. Committee Chairs shall be required to provide a report at each General meeting. A minimum of seven days prior notice shall be given of any change in published meeting dates. The regularly scheduled General meeting for December shall be held at the CSCC Awards banquet.

#### ARTICLE IV MANAGEMENT

The control and management of the club, its properties and facilities, its business and affairs shall be entrusted to a Board of Directors consisting of eight members to be elected as hereinafter provided.

#### ARTICLE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### **Section 1. POWERS:**

Subject at all times to these By-laws, the Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and enforce the rules regulating the operation and administration of the club; to elect new members; to appoint such committees as it may deem advisable and prescribe their duties; to make and enter such contracts as in its judgment and discretion may be deemed for the best interest of the club; to designate depositories for the funds of the club and the person or persons by whom checks drawn on such depositories shall be signed; to make, alter, amend and enforce rules for its own government and perform whatsoever it shall deem necessary to carry out the purposes of the club, in accordance with its Articles of Incorporation and these By-laws

The funds of the club shall be paid out only on the authority of the Board of Directors. Any action of the Board of Directors or club officers shall be subject to revision by a majority vote of the membership. Each Director shall have one vote, and be required to attend all meetings with the exceptions noted in Article V. Section 9. The Alternate will not have a vote until he/she assumes a director's position, but will be required to attend all meetings so that he/she will be current with Cascade business.

Voting will take place at the next General Meeting on May 12, 2018. Members are strongly encouraged to come to the meeting to provide input and to vote.

#### STANDING RULES

- 1. Newly elected officers and directors of the club will be announced and installed at the club meeting in December, which is the Annual Awards Banquet.
- 2. Perpetual trophies will be presented at the Annual Banquet. These will be retained until the following Annual Banquet. At this time, the previous winners will be presented with a trophy, which they may keep.
  - A. BUD KINDER MEMORIAL TROPHY FOR OUTSTANDING MEMBERSHIP: A committee consisting of the President, Membership Chairperson and a member selected from the floor, will be formed at the first General meeting of the year. The committee will be responsible for presenting a list of nominees and their contributions to consider for presentation of the nominations for the Board of Directors.

This list will be published prior to their presentation to the club. At this time, nominations will be accepted from the floor when accompanied by a written statement of the candidates' contributions. Balloting procedures, except the results, will be kept secret until announcement at the Banquet. The following criteria are to be considered in nominating outstanding membership candidates:

- (1) The candidate's contribution for the current calendar year.
- (2) Participation in a variety of club activities.
- (3) Loyalty and dedication to Cascade Sports Car Club.
- (4) The prior year's contributions are not to be considered for this award.
- B. PRESIDENT'S CUP: This is a President's choice award presented annually.
- C. ANNUAL DRIVER OF THE YEAR AWARD: To be selected by current ICSCC licensed drivers who hold a membership with Cascade Sports Car Club. This award to be presented at the Annual Awards Banquet to the one Cascade driver that best fits the following criteria:
  - (1) Current membership and licensing with Cascade Sports Car Club.
  - (2) Sportsmanship on and off the track.
  - (3) Driving ability and performance.
  - (4) Loyalty and dedication to Cascade Sports Car Club
- D. WORKER OF THE YEAR: This is a Race Chairman's choice award presented annually.
- E. EVERETT JOSSY MEMORIAL TROPHY: To be determined by being the high point CSCC driver in ICSCC point standings and by participating in at least three Conference point races in one season. Novices are eligible for championship trophies.
- F. WILLIAM DUNNICK MEMORIAL TROPHY: To be awarded to the CSCC driver showing the most improved performance during the past racing season. The winner will be chosen by secret ballot by CSCC race drivers holding ICSCC licenses.
- G. DAVID DEHAVEN MEMORIAL NOVICE OF THE YEAR AWARD: This award is chosen by a vote of the CSCC licensed drivers. It is presented to the first year Novice who has gained recognition through his or her driving abilities, sportsmanship on and off the track, and overall club participation.
- H. CRASH AND BURN AWARD: This award is chosen by a vote of the CSCC licensed drivers.
- I. RALLY DRIVER AND NAVIGATOR TROPHY: To be determined by a point system as proposed by the GearGrinders, for the annual Friday Night <u>Road</u> Rally Series. Only club members are eligible to earn points

Voting will take place at the next General Meeting on May 12, 2018. Members are strongly encouraged to come to the meeting to provide input and to vote.

#### **POLICIES AND PROCEDURES**

This section is intended to record continuing policies of the club. Its purpose is to <u>supplement</u>, not to supersede the By-laws and to help define committee responsibilities and Board policies.

#### 1. CLUB LOCKER:

- A. Unused trophies and supplies from events will be stored in the club's locker for possible use at future events.
- B. Keys to the locker will be given to four designated officials. The designated officers are: President, Race Chairperson, Course Marshal and Equipment Steward.
- C. The club Treasurer will be responsible for payment of locker rental fees.

#### 2. COMMITTEES:

#### A. Race Chairperson

- 1. Shall have overall responsibility for planning and conducting the racing events on dates scheduled and approved by the Board of Directors.
- 2. Shall present a proposed budget for Board approval prior to each event. Upon approval of the proposed budget, funds will be made available to the Race Chairperson as necessary for handling pre-event expenses.

#### B. Activities Calendar Chairperson

- 1. Shall be present or represented at all General meetings and give a report to the membership.
- 2. Shall furnish the Auspuff editor(s) with a current calendar of events prior to each publication.
- 3. Shall schedule after-meeting events, when requested.
- 4. Shall maintain a calendar of events in order to avoid conflicting event dates.

#### C. Activities Planning Committee

Any member wishing to organize a social event must contact the Activities Planning Committee

- 1. Shall arrange for the Picnic and/or Campout and annual banquet.
- 2. Shall submit a budget for each social event to the Board of Directors for approval prior to obligating funds.
- 3. Shall assist with organization of any additional social events in addition to the Picnic and/or Campout and annual banquet.

#### D. Drivers Training Chairperson

- 1. Shall be responsible for organization of Drivers Training.
- 2. Shall present a proposed budget to the Board of Directors for approval prior to conducting Drivers Training
- 3. Shall keep track of points and eligibility for year-end driver awards and submit a budget for Board approval before purchasing awards.

#### E. GearGrinders

Anyone wishing to set up a rally must contact GearGrinders

- 1. Shall be responsible for organization of GearGrinders sanctioned rallies.
- 2. Shall present a proposed budget to the Board for approval prior to obligating club funds for events or supplies.
- 3. Shall keep track of points and eligibility requirements for year-end awards and submit a budget for Board approval before purchasing awards.
- 4. Shall create and maintain "Road Rally Rules" guide. This guide shall include general procedures, term definitions, classes of competition, timing and scoring, and **Friday Night Road** Rally Series championship explanations. These rules shall govern operations of all club rallies and be reviewed and/or reprinted annually prior to the first event of the rally year as described in Standing Rule 2 (I).

#### F. ICSCC Executive Board Representative

The ICSCC Executive Board Representative and Alternate will be elected by the CSCC Board of Directors and will be empowered by the Board to carry out the duties of the office as described in the ICSCC Policy and Procedures Manual. The representative will take directions from the CSCC Board prior to the Spring and Fall meetings of the ICSCC and prior to special meetings when possible. He/She will be authorized to make necessary ICSCC Board decisions on matters as they arise and will report these to the CSCC general membership in a timely manner.

Voting will take place at the next General Meeting on May 12, 2018. Members are strongly encouraged to come to the meeting to provide input and to vote.

#### 6. CSCC RACE VOLUNTEER GUIDELINES AND BENEFITS

#### **Race Points:**

- Worker points are accrued throughout the year as reported by the Chief of each specialty or head of a Committee
- You must be a CSCC member to accrue year-end points. One point is awarded for each 1 hour of work (Note: time required for getting to and from events does not count towards race points). Awards based on accrued points are presented at the CSCC banquet.

#### **Race Volunteer Benefits:**

- Race points earned (for CSCC members only)
- Meals: (1) \$8 gift card for each day worked (signed for by volunteer each day upon check-in) and (1) free dinner ticket for Saturday night.
- Water is provided at all safety stations around the track
- Drink tickets each evening (2 tickets per person)
- Gift card drawings at race worker morning meeting. (On race day-usually on Sunday)
- Free CSCC banquet ticket for any race worker who works at least 4 full days at CSCC events during the calendar year. Events include CSCC races, drivers training and Enduro.

#### **Long Distance Reimbursement Guidelines:**

Long distance expenses are reimbursed by CSCC; make sure the CSCC Treasurer gets the required dated receipts and signed expense forms as soon as possible. within 60 days of the event. The CSCC Treasurer will supply reimbursement via check; no cash will be dispersed.

NOTE: This is for Race Event Weekends only, not "driver training" weekends.

- 1. If distance traveled is between 50-99 miles one way, you can be reimbursed for:
  - Gas: dated receipt for gas paid to and from the track OR -
  - Hotel: one (1) night lodging up to \$75 maximum (only race event weekends)
- 2. If distance traveled is over 100 miles one way, you can be reimbursed for:
  - Gas: dated receipt for gas paid to and from the track AND -
  - Hotel: one (1) night lodging up to \$75 maximum (only race event weekends)

#### **GearGrinders Rally Reimbursement Guidelines**

The GearGrinders Chair will typically act as liaison for passing reimbursement requests to CSCC Treasurer Friday Nighter Road Rally Series -masters -These expenses typically incurred by the rally-master, all require dated receipt excluding fuel stipend. \$40 Fuel Stipend

- Costs of **non-novice** event trophies, with receipts
- Costs of printing rally materials (route instructions, checkpoint slips, control logs, etc.) with receipts
- Other incidental costs (e.g. checkpoint batteries) with receipts

- Mountain to the Sea Trophies
- Supplies for finish location dinner, typically BBQ
- Other incidental costs, similar to above.

#### **Worker Hours**

Worker points for CSCC members are acquired by writing a rally, performing the pre-check, working a control, or performing administrative tasks (e.g. website maintenance, flyer creation). In lieu of exact hours, the following standard work hours can be used as an estimate:

- 1. Rally-master: Friday Nighter-40 hours, MttS-80 hours
- 2. Pre-check: 5 hours
- 3. Control worker: 4 hours

#### 7. CASCADE SPORTS CAR CLUB "OTHER" GUIDELINES

#### **General Meetings**

- Occurs on the first Saturday of each month unless the BoD chooses a different day due to conflicting
  events (such as a race weekend). Any change in date will be published in the AUSPUFF and added to the

#### **Awards Banquet**

- Gifts are given to CSCC Board members and Committee chairs
- Gifts are given to CSCC race workers/members for accrued points

#### **Outgoing President**

- Hands over gavel to the new President at the awards banquet
- Engraved gavel presented to the outgoing President at the awards banquet

#### Points

- Points are awarded 1 point per hour of work (partial hours are rounded up or down to full hour).
- Board members and Committee chairs get points for attending the General and Board meetings
- CSCC members who volunteer event weekends or are designated on a CSCC committee will receive points for each hour worked.
- Time required for getting to and from events does not count towards race points

#### Flowers & Cards

- If a CSCC member is sick or passes away, flowers and cards are usually sent
- If the family requests a donation to a charity the Board members will discuss
- Contact the CSCC Secretary or a Board member

# **CSCC Supplemental Regulations 2018**

#### Infractions will result in penalties assessed to the driver.

- Open to cars eligible under ICSCC current regulations.
- This event is organized under 2018 ICSCC Competition Regulations, and all who enter PIR are subject to them. Cascade Sports Car Club reserves
  the right to refuse entry to this event or to PIR at any time.
- Alcoholic beverages allowed in the beer garden area only, and only after the track closes. You may NOT bring alcohol into PIR!
   This is an Oregon Liquor Commission requirement. Any person caught entering PIR with alcohol will be removed from the raceway.
- Registration Hours: 6:00 pm-8:00 Friday, 7:30 am 1:30 pm Saturday and 7:30 am 10:30 am Sunday.
- 5. Express Tech is available at Registration for those drivers who have an acceptable, current Annual Tech inspection noted in their vehicle logbook. Express Tech drivers should bring their personal safety gear or race license with a current gear tech sticker on it along with their vehicle logbook and a completed and signed Tech Form to Registration and a weekend tech sticker will be issued.
- People under 18 years old are not allowed in hot pits, pre-grid or on victory laps. Children under 12 must have direct adult supervision at all times.
- A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult, must be on record for all minor participants brought into PIR.
- All persons in the racing "hot pit" (i.e. over the wall) shall wear shirts that cover the shoulders and shall not wear open toe shoes or be barefoot.
   Long pants are recommended.
- The scales will be open one hour before any qualifying session or race.
- 10. No skateboards or scooters allowed in the paddock area. Users of bicycles and small-motorized vehicles may have riding privileges revoked at any time by the Race Chairperson. No person under 12 is allowed to operate a bicycle or small-motorized vehicle in the paddock. Oregon Helmet Law is in effect at PIR. Protective headgear is required for any person under 16 riding a bicycle or being carried on a bicycle.
- 11. Refueling is not allowed in pre-grid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crewmember assigned only to operate a fire bottle. Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
- 12. PIR is a smoke free city park. No smoking is allowed.
- 13. Only one support vehicle allowed in the paddock. Pit and pre-grid roads must remain clear.
- 14. Noise rule ICSCC 1112 enforced! 103.0 dB at 50 ft.: no exceptions!
- 15. Oregon State Law requires functioning mufflers to be used at PIR. Functioning mufflers must be capable of reducing sound energy by at least 5dB at trackside. Cars losing mufflers, even if they are still below the sound level, may be black-flagged immediately.
- 16. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Also, damage to any equipment or devices used by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (CSCC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- Family and crewmembers of drivers are to contact the communication person at pre-grid with any questions regarding their driver or car while on track
- 18. All entrants for this event should have a sealable container or containers, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquid. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PIR. There will be no drums provided.
- 19. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from the raceway. This is a PIR regulation.
- 20. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular event, drivers and cars entered as an "additional event" will be restricted from participating, on a first-come, first-served priority based on the date entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by all drivers for whom the event is their primary event, including Novices upgrading to a championship event.
- NSF checks will be charged an additional \$50 fee.
- 22. The racing "hot pit" is defined as that area under the control of Hot Pits personnel. This area is located immediately west of the break in the concrete wall half way up the pit lane. At the one-minute warning pre-grid must be cleared of all crew, support personnel and spectators. Notwithstanding the above, ICSCC rule #1607 does not apply to the pre-grid area.
- 23. All cars that are towed into the paddock area are subject to being dropped off in impound. Drivers must wear all required drivers safety equipment (per ICSCC rule # 1105) before they are allowed to enter the track, while they are on the track, beyond positive protection, under flat tow, or in the hot pits area.
- 24. Extension cords from the pit exit to tech/scales must be secured to the pavement at all times.
- 25. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the
- 26. Blend Line- You are required to stay to the right of the Red Blend line as you enter the racetrack from the pit area until the Red Blend line ends. This is REQUIRED EVERY TIME you enter the Race Track, other than the race out lap. Blend gradually after Blend line has ended.
  Pit Commitment Line at the exit of Turn 12 If you exit the race track at any time, you are required to stay completely to the right of the Red Pit Commitment Line. If you cross the Pit Commitment Line with ONE TIRE you are required to stay out for one more lap unless you are exiting the track after you have received the checkered flag and crossed the start/finish line.
- SPEED LIMITS: Pit lane speed limit is 35 MPH from the bridge to pit out. Paddock speed limit is 5 MPH
- MOVE IN RULES FOR PIR AS FOLLOWS: NO VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED IN PIT AREA ON THURSDAY AT ANY
  TIME. IF YOU REQUEST AN EARLY MOVE IN PRIOR TO 6AM FRIDAY CONTACT GARY BOCKMAN (503) 209-6349.
- The area to the north of the Pro Tower is reserved parking for ICSCC and CSCC officials.
- 30. Drivers are responsible AT ALL TIMES for their crew members and guests.

Win the same class in each of the four Cascade Championship races and win the **Cascade Grand Slam!** Winners receive a Grand Slam trophy and \$400.00. All classes that average at least three entries are eligible for the Cascade Grand Slam.

If the Cascade Grand Slam slipped through your grasp or your class averages less than three entries, don't worry, there is still the Cascade Cup!

The **Cascade Cup** is a championship series that counts points in each of Cascade's four championship races. Points follow the ICSCC Championship point structure. All drivers are eligible regardless of club or license affiliation. You must enter all four races to be eligible. Trophies are awarded to all class Champions. Trophies for 2<sup>nd</sup> place are also awarded in classes that average at least four entries as well as for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in classes that average at least six entries.

Races are one hour in length except for the final race which is two hours and counts as two races (single points times 2). Note: Time does not stop for black flags or red flags

Top 6 races count towards the points championship. Must enter a minimum of four races in order to qualify for the championship.

Each one hour entry shall consist of one or two drivers. Each two hour entry may have no more than four drivers. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race.

Each one hour race will require a mandatory 60 second pit stop. Each two hour race will require a mandatory two minute pit stop.

Entry fee, qualifying procedure, etc. will be determined by sponsoring club and may be different between events.

Classes: ME0 - AP, SPO, SPM, GT1, GT2, GT3, ITE, ST

ME1 - BP, EIP, FIP, GTL, RS, AS, SE46, SPU

ME2 - CP, DP, PRO3, ITS, PRO44, HIP

ME3 - EP, FP, GP, HP, IP, CR, PRO7, SM, CSM, HT, ITA, ITB, ITC

MSR - SPORTS RACER CLASS (Open to ICSCC eligible Sports Racers)

Car numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Points: 1<sup>st</sup> - 12, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 10, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 9, 4<sup>th</sup> - 8, 5<sup>th</sup> - 7, 6<sup>th</sup> - 6, 7<sup>th</sup> - 5, 8<sup>th</sup> - 4, 9<sup>th</sup> - 3, 10<sup>th</sup> & lower - 2, Pole - 1 (where applicable / No pole points for 2 hour races). All positions are scored except as noted: DNF/DNS score a maximum of 6<sup>th</sup> place points. Number of laps completed will determine position for DNF's. All DNS's score the same number of points based on the number of cars in class.

Championship trophies will be awarded to class champions in classes that average .75 entries. Championship trophies will be awarded to the top 3 in classes that average 5 entries.

Eligibility: Licenses – ICSCC IRR, SCCA, CACC, FIA, ASN, or NASA. All other licenses must be approved by the ICSCC License Director. Novice license holders are not eligible.

This championship series is a great way to get in more racing over the course of the weekend. Race in the series for the championship or race in it to do more racing, either way it is a great opportunity to maximize your track time for the race weekend!

#### FULL SET OF RULES:

Entry to this race does **not** have to be in conjunction with any other race(s) of the weekend.

Except as noted, the 2018 ICSCC Competition Regulations will apply.

Maximum number of drivers per race: 1 Hour Races - two. 2 Hour Races - four. Teams may petition the Race Steward to have additional drivers. Drivers on teams that use more than the maximum number of drivers will receive full points if the driver has driven a minimum of fifteen minutes. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race.

Car numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Points: See above (page 1) for point structure. Each driver will receive the same points whether an entry is one or multiple drivers. Example: If a one driver entry wins - 12 points are awarded. If a two driver entry wins - 12 points are awarded to each driver. Pole points will be awarded to both drivers. If a driver drives in two different cars in the same race, they will only receive points for the higher finish if the two cars are in the same class. If the two cars are in different classes, the driver will receive points for both classes. The Series Championship (each class) will be determined by adding a drivers six highest point totals together. Ties in final points shall be resolved on the basis of each driver's record of first place finishes; then, if necessary, second place finishes. If two or more drivers have accumulated the same number of first and second place finishes, they shall be considered tied for the Championship. If for example two drivers tie for the Championship, the next driver shall be considered to have finished in third place.

Mandatory Pit Stop: Each one hour race will have a mandatory 60 second pit stop to be made between the 20 minute mark and the 40 minute mark of the race for both one driver and two driver entries. Each two hour race will have a mandatory two minute pit stop to be made between the 30 minute mark and the 90 minute mark of the race for both one driver and multiple driver entries. Pit stops may be made before or after the mandatory pit window but will not count towards the mandatory pit stop. The car's ignition must be turned off while refueling as well as when a driver change is taking place. All crew members who have the potential to come into direct contact with gasoline or gasoline vapors during pit stops are required to wear the following safety gear: A fire suit, fire resistant gloves, head sock, and helmet. A fire bottle designee is also required in case of a fire; however, they are not required to wear the same safety gear. No contact with the car is allowed while refueling except for a driver change. Helping a driver get belted in, radios plugged in, and cleaning the front windshield are not considered contact with the car and may occur at the time of refueling if necessary. Pit crew attire: Arms, legs, and feet shall be fully covered.

> The Pit lane speed limit and zones shall be determined by the sponsoring club. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into their pit space. During a Full Course Yellow (FCY), pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a FCY, you will be released to rejoin the field. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the re-start of the race. If a FCY or Black/Red flag extends past the mandatory pit window, two green flag laps will be added to the pit window. The clock will continue to run under race stoppage.

If during a one hour race, a car returns to the paddock or has to be towed in, they will have been considered to have withdrawn from the race and will not be permitted to re-enter the track. This rule does not apply to two hour races.

Minimum Penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 1 liter – Stop & Go. Improper attire on crew members over the wall, no fire bottle designee – Penalty Box: 30 seconds. Working on car during re-fueling – Penalty Box: 1 minute. Mandatory pit stop window violation: 2 lap penalty (1 hour races), 3 lap penalty (2 hour races). All others – Warning

Trophies: One or two in class - 1st only; three to five in class - 1st & 2nd; six or more - 1st, 2nd, 3rd

MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING - See schedule. Failure to attend may result in starting at the rear of the field.

Each sponsoring club is responsible for setting the qualifying procedure. Qualifying sessions may vary from what is listed below. Check event schedule for the most up to date information.

## QUALIFYING PROCEDURES

ROUND 1 - MAY 5, 2018: Pressure qualifying. Either driver may qualify. Qualifying shall consist of

one Green flag lap (one out lap and one green flag lap). Qualifying order

shall be set by class with MSR first, then ME0, ME1, ME2, and ME3 last. The starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest.

ROUND 2 - MAY 19, 2018: 10-15 minute qualifying session. The starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest

ROUND 3 - JUNE 2, 2018: 10 minute qualifying session. The starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest

ROUND 4 - JUNE 15, 2018: 10 minute qualifying session. The starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest

ROUND 5 - JULY 21, 2018: 10-15 minute qualifying session. The starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest

ROUND 6 - AUGUST 18, 2018: 10 minute qualifying session. Starting grid shall be set fastest to slowest

ROUND 7 - SEPTEMBER 15, 2018: 10-15 minute qualifying session. Starting grid shall be set fastest - slow

ROUND 8 - SEPTEMBER 29, 2018: Lemans start - No qualifying, no pole points
