Happy New Year Cascade Members & Friends!





Cascade Sports Car Club's Road Rally program (aka Cascade Geargrinders) organizes TSD (time-speed-distance) road rallies in and around Portland, Oregon.

CASCADE SPORTS CAR

What is a TSD road rally?

A game that takes you places.

A scenic drive on country roads.

A fun autosport competition for teams of all levels.

Cascade Geargrinders road rallies are beginner friendly events, starting and ending in the Portland area. Rallies are about 100 miles long and take three to four hours to complete. First car starts at 10:01 a.m.

Is special equipment needed?

Entry requires a street-legal vehicle, a licensed insured driver, a navigator, and a smart device (e.g., cell phone or tablet) running the Competitor Richta GPS Checkpoints app (app is free).

Online registration is required: MotorsportReg.com

What events does Cascade Geargrinders offer?

Rally School – Start the season with a virtual review of TSD road rally rules and procedures on Friday evening. Then run a practice road rally on Saturday morning to test your driving skills and navigational knowledge.

Saturday Rally Series – Compete for Series awards. Best five of six finishes count toward Series points. Must run at least three to win an award.

Mountains to the Sea – Enjoy a full-day tour-style road rally, following a fun to drive scenic route, starting in Portland and ending at the Pacific Ocean (perhaps Newport).

Ghouls Gambol – Caution: May include tricks and treats. Optional decorated car show. This daytime rally explores autumn colors around Portland's foothills and farmland. Ends at Spirit of Halloweentown in St. Helens.

Oregon Trailblazer – In 2023 we welcome the return of an occasional Cascade tradition – a tricky TSD rally that challenges your team's driving and navigational skills. Expect tricks and traps. (The last Oregon Trailblazer Rally was in 2006.) (Not included in Series Pass or Season Ticket.)

What does it cost?

All rallies except Mountains to the Sea:

Entry fee: \$20 per car for CSCC members

\$30 per car for non-members

Mountains to the Sea:

Entry fee: \$50 per car for CSCC members

\$75 per car for non-members

Oregon Trailblazer Rally

New for the 2023 season is the return of the Oregon Trailblazer rally. The first running of this event was in 1961 as Cascade's entry into the inaugural Northwest Rally Council championship. Northwest Rally Council had just been formed by the Conference clubs with rally programs at that time.

After being held each year for several years, the Oregon Trailblazer rally became a less frequent event, offered only when there was a rallymaster willing to write this all-day rally. In most recent memory, it was always the trickiest and most technical rally of the season.

The 2023 Oregon Trailblazer rally will follow in the steps of its most recent predecessors. It will be a trick and trap rally – a true Saagerpalooza. But fear not. Even if you get the traps wrong, you will survive to complete the rally. The rally will be designed to ensure that everyone finishes.

You've got plenty of time to decide if this is the event for you. Come to Rally School, run the Saturday Series rallies, join us for Mountains to the Sea and Ghouls Gambol, and then decide if you've got what it takes to run the 62nd Anniversary Oregon Trailblazer Rally.



THREE THIEVES RACING TEAM

Three Thieves Racing Team took on our three Enduros and won the 2 Hour, 4 Hour and 8 Hours of Endurance with Cascade in October. They finished 363 laps by the time the 8 Hour was done. Congratulations to this team and I hope they will be back with us next year. This sort of matches their name, correct?

Then the Three Thieves team went on to do pretty darn great in the 25 Hours of Thunderhill in December. (I am wondering though who is the third thief). The following information was taken from the live feed of the race. The local NW Three Thieves Racing team of Tom Burt and Phil Fogg Jr., two other drivers and an amazing crew, won their class in an Audi R8 prepared by AR Motorsports in Tigard. (Tom, as you'll remember, won the 8 hours of the Cascades back in October). What is funny about their win at Thunderhill is that at some point they had a big off and went way out into the dirt and mud. When they finally got the car back into the pits, the entire team, with the use of water hoses, took 25 minutes to clean all the mud out of the car!

Initially it was thought brake failure was the reason the Audi R8 went off track, but it was a driver error, said crew chief Martin Sarukhanyan of Three Thieves Racing.

"That set us off the track about 300 feet and it took I think like 40 minutes to dig out," Sarukhanyan said, noting that crews had to use several tow straps and ropes to free the R8. "We dragged the car over to the hose over and dug out probably like 80 pounds of mud. Everybody was cleaning it for probably 25 minutes.

The team also lost a starter in the middle of the night, so they either had to leave the car running or push-start it. In the closing hours Sunday afternoon, the car went four off in Turn 1 and stalled, and with no way to start it, the car was stranded in Turn 1, bringing out double yellows. Safety workers towed the car back to the pits at which point the Three Thieves crew push-started the car and it rejoined the race. Even with the setback, the team finished seventh overall, completing 553 laps and completing more than 1,600 miles over the 25-hour race.

"Late in the race, you know, the tires were pretty old. We were about to come in in five minutes, fresh tires, fuel and a new driver to finish the race, and went into Turn 1, and the rear just lost grip and he went around," said Sarukhanyan. "So if we had the starter working, it would have been fine. But unfortunately that wasn't the case for us today."

That late-night trip off track in the fast Turn 7 knocked Three Thieves Racing out of the running for the overall podium, but as the lone entry in ES, the team took the class win and finished seventh overall.

A MYSTERY CAR TO IDENTIFY....


PLEASE HELP IF YOU HAVE ANY INFORMATION

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
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
