Dear Cascade Members,

The Board of Directors selected a group of several members to work on revising/updating the Club's

By-laws, Standing Rules, and Policies and Procedures. It had been several years since we last did this. A number of things have changed and we need to get them current and in-line with how we are now operating. As a review, the procedure for changing the bylaws as stated is:

Section 1. These By-laws may be changed at any regular General Meeting of the club. A two-thirds vote of the members present is required to change the By-Laws. There must be prior notice:

By announcement at a preceding meeting and publication of the intended change(s) in the Auspuff

Section 2. Standing Rules and Policies and Procedures may be changed at any General meeting by a majority vote of members present. There must be prior notice:

By announcement at a preceding meeting and publication of the intended change in the Auspuff

The committee came up with a number of changes/upgrades. Below is a summary of the proposed changes:

CSCC RACE VOLUNTEER GUIDELINES AND BENEFITS FOR 2022

These benefits are for a full day of volunteering at a specialty.

Every volunteer that works Friday Driver's School/HPDE/TNT will receive \$10 travel money. This includes those that will be receiving long distance travel for the weekend. This money will be handed out on Saturday morning at registration.

All volunteers (<u>other than those that receive long distance travel reimbursement)</u>, that sign up and work both days, <u>Saturday and Sunday</u>; will receive \$15 in cash for local travel. This money will be handed out Sunday morning at registration.

A \$15 gift card each day of the race weekend, Saturday and Sunday with your choice of Fred Meyer/ Safeway -or- a voucher for lunch from the Concession stand. Voucher for Concession stand is \$15. This will be handed out each day at morning registration.

Three (3) Beverage Tickets for the weekend. All three tickets will be given out on Saturday.

Long distance travel reimbursement Guidelines.

Reimbursement will require that the volunteers sign up on MotorsportsReg.

All Volunteers that travel 50 to 99 miles will be given \$50.

All volunteers that travel 100 to 199 miles will be given \$100.

All volunteers that travel 200 plus miles will be given \$150.

Long Distance Travel is for a two-day weekend, Saturday and Sunday.

Long Distance Travel reimbursement is for CSCC events only. Not events that CSCC supports. (i.e.) Nascar, Formula E, Rosecup, SVRA, and Indy Car.

Again, those entitled to Travel Reimbursement, must sign up on MotorsportsReg. This will allow us to plan on how much money will be required for the weekend and what mileage funds are needed. Long Distance travel money will be handed out Sunday morning at registration.

If dinner is provided Saturday evening, the dinner is free for all volunteers.

There will be a drawing at the end of the season, probably at the October Enduro. Winners of the drawing will not be required to be at the event.

Every volunteer will receive a drawing ticket for each day they work. Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The tickets will be put into the drawing bucket. This will be done for every CSCC race and Enduro. When we have the drawing, a person will win only once. All names will be in the bucket for the top prize. The dollar amount and how many will be determine by the money received from the "Worker Fund Donations".

"NOSTALGIC SERIES" WEEKEND TOURNAMENT & CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

WHAT IS IT: A 3 weekend, 9 race series for Production cars, Formula cars, and Sports Racers that are at least 20 years old.

SCHEDULE: (1) April 29 - 30 @ PIR, (2) June 17-18 @ PIR, (3) August 12-13 @ PIR

CLASSES: PO – Production cars w/open modifications (engine swaps/aero) P1 – Production cars 1999cc and under, P2 – Production cars 2000cc – 2999cc, P3 – Production cars 3000cc – 3999cc, P4 – Production cars 4000cc and over, F – Formula cars, SR – Sports Racers. Turbocharged or Supercharged cars multiply displacement by a factor of 1.4 Rotary powered cars: 12A – P2 13B – P3

POINTS, WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS, AND SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP:

<u>PER RACE</u> – Earn 1 point for each race lap completed plus 4 bonus points for 1st in class, 3 bonus points for 2nd in class, and 2 bonus points for 3rd in class.

Points from all three races of the weekend will be added together to determine the **WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS** for each class.

Trophies will be awarded based on the number of cars in class: 1-2 cars in class -1^{st} only, 3-5 cars in class -1^{st} and 2^{nd} , 6 or more cars in class -1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} .

The **SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP** for each class will be determined by adding the points from a driver's best 7 races together. Ties will be determined by the number of 1st place finishes. Must enter a minimum of 6 races (two weekends) in order to qualify for the Nostalgic Series Championship.

Championship trophies will be awarded as follows: To the class champion in classes that average at least 1 entry (9 total class entries for the series) and to the top three in classes that average at least 4 entries (36 total class entries for the series).

THIS IS A STRICT <u>NO CONTACT</u> SERIES WHERE THE GOAL IS TO HAVE FUN WHILE SHOWCASING SENTIMENTAL CARS FROM THE PAST. MINIMUM PENALTIES FOR AT FAULT CONTACT ARE PROBATION FOR THE REST OF THE SERIES UP TO SUSPENSION FROM THE SERIES FOR ONE YEAR. IF WHILE ON PROBATION A DRIVER HAS CONTACT, THEY WILL BE IMMEDIATELY EXCLUDED FROM THE SERIES FOR A MINIMUM OF 13 MONTHS, LOSE ALL POINTS, AND BECOME INELIGIBLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

SAFETY:

ICSCC minimum safety standards as set forth in Section 11 of the current year ICSCC Competition Regulations shall apply. Cars that meet Vintage racing organization's standards may be accepted with proof that the car has been approved to race by those organizations.

MODIFICATIONS:

There shall be no minimum weight for the Nostalgic Series thus no need to scale after the races.

Production class cars shall fit the spirit of "Production" cars thus modifications should be similar to those allowed in ICSCC Improved Production classes (SCCA Production). Most current ICSCC classes other than most GT, SP, and ITE cars are considered within the spirit of Production cars. Cars such as the Caterham 7 and Factory Five Roadster fit into the spirit of the Nostalgic Series. Furthermore, the Cascade Competition Board reserves the right to include any car into the series they feel meets the spirit of the series.

TIRES:

Production cars shall run on DOT approved tires. Sports Racers and Formula cars may run on slicks.

DRIVER CONDUCT:

This is racing; however, car to car contact will not be tolerated. Drivers are expected to leave racing room and to be aware of their surroundings. They should avoid contact whenever possible. There is the potential for a wide disparity of speed and types of cars so situational awareness is paramount.

GRIDDING FOR RACES:

Qualifying times will be used to set the grid for race one (fastest first to slowest last). The grids for subsequent races will be set using a driver's fastest lap time from the previous race (fastest first to slowest last). See Split Starts below. Session lengths: Qual. -20min. / Races -20 min.

SPLIT STARTS:

Production classes and Sports Racers/Formula classes will utilize a split start for each race. The Race Steward has sole discretion over which group starts first and will take into consideration the number of cars in each of the classes as well as lap times.

OTHER: Except for what is listed above, rules and procedures will follow the current ICSCC Competition Regulations. Questions about the series, contact: racing@cascadesportscarclub.org

Feb. 18 Rally School

After reviewing their assigned homework, teams gathered at a Friday evening Zoom meeting for a rally school review of rally rules, procedures and protocols. Questions were answered to prepare for the practice rally on Saturday morning.

About the rally

The rally course was about 85 miles from the start in northwest Portland to the ending location in Forest

Grove, and it took about three and a half hours to complete. The route traveled through Washington Park, along Skyline and into Washington County, on roads used for Cascade road rally for decades – West Union, Helvetia,

Jackson Quarry. The route then made its way down Mason Hill and into North Plains for a mid-rally break, ending at the Jessie Mays Community Park.

After the break the course headed out Pumpkin Ridge, through Roy, up Clapshaw Hill and down Hillside, through Verboort, and on to the ending location at the Prime Time in Forest Grove. Several teams met up at the

We like solving puzzles, learning new skills, driving, and exploring new areas -- the rally offered all these and much more! We enjoyed talking with the other teams at the start location -- everyone was so friendly!

Thanks for helping us out today.

We had a lot of fun on the rally. It was through areas I hadn't been in for years, and many roads I had never seen. It was great to explore, which is something the two of us do regularly during the summer months. Much of it was what I was expecting, though many of the traps sure got me... this time!

The school taught us everything we needed to know to run our first rally together. The most helpful aspect was probably learning how to understand and work with the route instructions and rallymaster notes (via all the handouts and the Zoom meeting) -- it's a whole new language that would have been a real struggle to learn any other way.

We're already making plans to run the March rally. We had a lot of fun running the rally school route, and we can't wait to test ourselves with another Cascade road rally!

What the rallymasters said

Some of this event may have seemed familiar. We reused parts of an event we put on a couple of years ago. Since rally school is a teaching opportunity, we retained some "tried and true" rally challenges.

A number switch (numbered route instructions printed out of numerical order) had some cars traveling through a rural neighborhood in one direction, while other cars went the opposite way, providing opportunity for rally cars to wave and wonder...are we off course or are they?

A spelling trap offered another opportunity for some teams to go one way while the others took a different route. Everyone rejoined a common route, with those who didn't notice the spelling error getting a few extra penalty points.

Two instructions offered a lesson in defined terms vs signs. Both opportunities occurred at railroad crossings:

PAUSE 15 seconds at STOP ITIS
PAUSE 15 seconds at "STOP" ITIS

In the first case, STOP is a defined term, so you're looking to pause at an intersection with a legal highway stop sign at which the contestant must stop. Since an intersection is defined as a crossing of rally roads at which the contestant could proceed in more than one direction, and since no such intersection exists at the railroad crossing, the correct action is to skip this ITIS instruction and its pause.

In the second case, you're looking to pause at a sign that reads stop. There is clearly a stop sign at the railroad crossing, so the correct action is to do the pause there and not skip the ITIS instruction.

Two notes were included. One was used only by cars who fell for the number switch. The other note was a sign hunt to pause every time you saw a particular sign. The note was introduced near the end of the rally and was correctly used three times.

Congratulate the winners

There are no prizes for this practice rally, but we do recognize winners. Fame and glory!

First overall and first in the SOP class was the team of David and JoAnn Gattman with a score of 118. With just 3 more points, second overall and second SOP was Russ and Kate Sherrell with 121 points. Lee and Patricia Nielsen finished third overall and third SOP with 178 points.

All three of the top finishing Novice teams were first-time Cascade ralliers. First Novice with a score of 233 was the father/son team of Jeff and Nicholas Crews. Second Novice was the team of Gene and Sandy Buzzelli with a score of 244. Finishing third Novice was the father/daughter team of Isaac and Scout Miller with 321.

Northwest Rally Council update

History tidbit: Way back in 1960, the Cascade Sports Car Club Board of Directors passed a resolution approving formation of the Northwest Rally Council (NWRC). Several conference clubs that had rally programs joined to form this new organization. As a charter member, Cascade's annual NWRC rally was the Oregon Trail Blazer (a rally title being revived this coming November).



NWRC member clubs have continued to put on TSD road rallies under the NWRC umbrella for decades. Somewhere along the way, Cascade dropped its membership in NWRC. Cascade was no longer a

member and memory of its involvement in the NWRC's formation was lost by the time we (Saagers) joined the club in 1985. Cascade's role as a charter member was rediscovered recently when notebooks of club board minutes from the 50s and 60s were reviewed.

The pandemic years were hard on many rally clubs. Events were canceled; some have not come back. Cascade's rally program was sustained by adapting and changing, by offering contact-free road rally. Other clubs were slower to adapt and change.

NWRC's member clubs are centered around the Seattle area. Their Friday Nighters have started from the park and ride in Bellevue on the second Friday night for many years. The style and format of their rallies remained unchanged for decades. When the pandemic came, attendance in their rallies fell. Some events were canceled. This season, they were in danger of canceling their long-standing Friday Nighter series.

The big news is NWRC has just announced that the Richta GPS checkpoints app will be used for some of NWRC's 2023 Friday Nighters. Hopefully modernization of NWRC's rally program will help improve attendance and sustain their program.
