There is a revision to the minutes of the July Board Meeting. Scott and Torm are contracted with SOVERN not SVRA for their services. The minutes were then approved unanimously.

GearGrinders: There is a rally on August 19. Cody will give a brief review of rallying for GearGrinders at the general meeting. He wants to make it more informative for those attending the meeting. He will go over the results of the rally that was done in the month of the meeting.

Treasurer: The taxes have been paid for the year of 2022. We need to pay attention to our spending as that was a large amount of money. The new person at the accounting firm was good and they stood up to their end of dealing with the taxes.

Auspuff: Cathy is doing a great job. We need to get our information to her sooner.
The Dash discussed as to what we have going and how it will all be coming together. The shirts are on order and people are stepping up to make this happen.

E-Board and Enduro: Chris has nothing for the E-Board. The entries are low for the Enduro at this time.
Contest Board: Brian let us know about the protest that was handled. There is much discussion about the Black Flag since that was what the protest was over. Also, the handling of shorts at HPDE and in which areas of the track we are allowed them.

Race Chairman: Mike reported we have 85 entries at this time and there are 35 for the TnT . He will make sure the cash machine is full for the race. The TC Band has asked for an area to perform at The Dash. They are also looking for an area where they can all put together. Safety I has been serviced and the air conditioner is fixed. We discussed the equipment cover again. Mike has yet to make contact with the person that will be doing it.

Drivers Training/HPDE: Chris reported there are 18 instructors signed up.
Membership: Steve will introduce 4 new members at the general meeting.
Points Keeper: Chiefs need to get their points in after the races.

## New Business:

We need to discuss if there are points for SVRA.
There also needs to be a push to get roles and responsibilities of the different chiefs' positions, club committees and other areas defined so new people understand what they might be taking on. This is an ongoing process.

We need to work on making sure we have a worker's school in the coming spring.
There was discussion about how chiefs should be members of the club. It was noted that they earn points and gifts and some of this would pay for the membership. How important is it to have them be members of the club.

We need to start thinking about a year end inventory and what repairs or replacements we need to make.
Childrens helmets were discussed. Jon Brobst gave us 14 Zox helmets that are in the container.
The Sound budget was discussed. We need to pay the sound person for the Friday service since it is required for the City of Portland. Conference pays for the race weekend but we, as a club, need to be responsible for the Friday event. It amounts to $\$ 150$ per day.

Steve brought up the consumables for SVRA. He will contact Adam and if it doesn't amount to much, the club will assume it in the contract price. If it is large, we may want to present them with a bill.

We need to bill NASCAR, Formula E and Rose Cups for Darrell to pay the $\$ 5,000$.

This all-day time-speed-distance road rally includes GPS-timed checkpoints, time of day restarts, and a Monte Carlo section. Most route instructions are accompanied by official mileage. Checkpoints are identified in the route instructions.

Weather permitting, we plan to have a beach fire. Bring your beach blanket and a piece of firewood and join in. Watch for more information.
Entry requires a street-legal vehicle, a licensed and insured driver, a navigator, and a smart device (e.g., cell phone or tablet) running the Competitor Richta GPS Checkpoints app (app is free). Online registration is required.

Entry fee is $\$ 50$ per car for CSCC members, $\$ 75$ per car for non-members.

## August 19 Saturday Series Rally

## What the rallymasters said

Rallymasters Torm Kelsey-Green and Kasey Klaus created a tour-style event (no navigational or time-keeping tricks or traps) that offered plenty of brisk driving and incredible scenery. The fact that there were 26 timed checkpoints offered more than enough challenge to keep folks engaged.

All but three of the teams joined Kasey at the Black Bear Diner in Wilsonville after the rally, sharing that they enjoyed the event. Stories were told of almost zero legs and self-imposed errors. Another great Saturday Series Rally!
Kasey and Torm enjoyed putting this course together. They tested the Richta GPS Checkpoints app's ability to set up directional checkpoints that will time cars only if they are traveling in the correct direction. Their route doubled back on itself, came back and ran the same roads going in the opposite direction, and had checkpoints going both directions on the same road. It all worked perfectly! And watching the rally teams on the Rallymaster Map as they progressed through the pretzelized course was a riot. (You have to be a rallymaster to really appreciate the Richta Rallymaster Map.)

## About the rally

The August rally was about 100 miles from the start in Milwaukie to the ending location in Wilsonville. It took about four hours to complete. The odometer calibration transit ended in King City. The rally route traveled west of Sherwood, along Mountain Top Road with spectacular views into the Chehalem Valley, then into Newberg for a break at Johnson's Landing County Park on the Willamette River.
After break, the route crisscrossed through the Parrett Mountain/Ladd Hill area, with even more spectacular views, eventually ending in Wilsonville.

The 2023 Northwest Mini Enduro Championship Series (NWMECS) is about at the halfway point. Just four weekends remain of which the final one is a two-hour race and counts as two single races. The remaining races are in Spokane (July), Portland and the Ridge (August), and then back at Portland (October).

Here are the drivers who are leading their classes at the halfway point. Grimsrud and Storgaard have a commanding lead in MSR. In MEO, Krause is plus 9 over Remfert while in ME1, Ecker is up 9 points on Dawson. The ME2 battle is tight with Groeneveld up 5 over Alleva and finally in ME3, Bienerth is up big over the other cars in class. With half of the season still to go though, the championships are far from being decided!

The ICSCC race season officially ends October 14 th at Cascade's Festival of Endurance. The 2, 4, and 8 hour races (all combined into one) are a great way to cap off the season! This race uses the historic LeMans start which most drivers can't get enough of! The 8 hour finishes in the dark and prize money is on the table again for the 8 hour portion if it has at least 25 entries.

For 2 hour and 4 hour entries (and broken 8 hour entries), there will be a track crossing at 5:30pm for those teams to exit the track and head home.

As a reminder, ICSCC's Enduro License gives experienced racers an avenue to be able to race endurance races (races at least one hour in length) with ICSCC. Whether you're a previously licensed driver or a driver who comes from the budget racing scene, there is a good chance you qualify for the ICSCC Enduro License. For only $\$ 25$, drivers with racing experience can be part of a team.

There are still plenty of opportunities to race with ICSCC in 2023 on both the endurance side and the sprint racing side so hope we see you at a race soon!

If horsepower and WT:HP are in different classes, the Race Steward shall determine class. P0-225 to 275HP, 10.0-12.0 WT:HP; P1- 180 to $225 \mathrm{HP}, 12.0-15.5 \mathrm{WT}: \mathrm{HP} ; ~ P 2-135$ to $180 \mathrm{HP}, 15.5-19.0 \mathrm{WT}: \mathrm{HP} ; \quad$ P3-below 135 HP , above $19.0 \mathrm{WT}: \mathrm{HP}$. A dyno form is not required. WT is minimum race weight with driver. Cars in Production classes (P0-P3) using tires with a treadwear rating of 180 or higher may move down one class. All other classes listed follow ICSCC rules.

Points: $\quad 1^{\text {st }}-12,2^{\text {nd }}-10,3^{\text {rd }}-9,4^{\text {th }}-8,5^{\text {th }}-7,6^{\text {th }}-6,7^{\text {th }}-5,8^{\text {th }}-4,9^{\text {th }}-3,10^{\text {th }} \&$ lower -2 , Pole -1 (where applicable / No pole points for 2 hour races). Maximum number of drivers per race: 1 Hour Races - two. 2 Hour Races - four. Teams may petition the Race Steward to have additional drivers. Drivers on teams that use more than the maximum number of drivers will receive full points if the driver has driven a minimum of fifteen minutes. In all other cases a driver must drive in the race to score points unless the car DNF's. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race. Where a driver is found racing without registering, the team will at a minimum be disqualified.

Car numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.
Points: See above (page 1) for point structure. Each driver will receive the same points whether an entry is one or multiple drivers. Example: If a one driver entry wins - 12 points are awarded. If a two driver entry wins - 12 points are awarded to each driver. Pole points will be awarded to both drivers. If a driver drives in two different cars in the same race, they will only receive points for the higher finish if the two cars are in the same class. If the two cars are in different classes, the driver will receive points for both classes. The Series Championship (each class) will be determined by adding a driver's six highest point totals together. Ties in final points shall be resolved on the basis of each driver's record of first place finishes; then, if necessary, second place finishes. If two or more drivers have accumulated the same number of first and second place finishes, they shall be considered tied for the Championship. If for example two drivers tie for the Championship, the next driver shall be considered to have finished in third place.

Mandatory Pit Stop: Each one hour race will have a mandatory 60 second pit stop to be made between the 20 minute mark and the 40 minute mark of the race for both one driver and two driver entries. Each two hour race will have a mandatory two minute pit stop to be made between the 30 minute mark and the 90 minute mark of the race for both one driver and multiple driver entries. Pit stops may be made before or after the mandatory pit window but will not count towards the mandatory pit stop. The car's ignition must be turned off while refueling as well as when a driver change is taking place. All crew members who have the potential to come into direct contact with gasoline or gasoline vapors during pit stops are required to wear the following safety gear: A fire suit, fire resistant gloves, head sock, and helmet. A fire bottle designee is also required in case of a fire; however, they are not required to wear the same safety gear. No contact with the car is allowed while refueling except for a driver change. Helping a driver get belted in, radios plugged in , and cleaning the front windshield are not considered contact with the car and may occur at the time of refueling if necessary. Pit crew attire: Arms, legs, and feet shall be fully covered.

The Pit lane speed limit and zones shall be determined by the sponsoring club. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into their pit space. During a Full Course Yellow (FCY), pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a FCY, you will be released to rejoin the field. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the re-start of the race. If a FCY or Black/Red flag extends past
the mandatory pit window, two green flag laps will be added to the pit window. The clock will continue to run under race stoppage.

Minimum Penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 1 liter - Stop \& Go. Improper attire on crew members over the wall, no fire bottle designee - Penalty Box: 30 seconds. Working on car during re-fueling Penalty Box: 1 minute. Mandatory pit stop window violation: 2 lap penalty ( 1 hour races), 3 lap penalty ( 2 hour races). All others - Warning

Trophies: One or two in class $-1^{\text {st }}$ only; three to five in class $-1^{\text {st }} \& 2^{\text {nd }} ;$ six or more $-1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$
