



Ghouls Gambol Rally Results

Twenty-six teams entered Cascade Sports Car Club's 57th Ghouls Gambol Rally on Oct. 28. It was a beautiful sunny day. Many rally teams arrived at the start in decorated



cars with coordinating costumes.

By the time rally cars arrived at the end of the rally in downtown St. Helens, Spirit of Halloweentown was already crowded.

About the rally

The Ghouls Gambol Rally was about 90 miles long from the start in northwest Portland to the ending location in St. Helens. It took about three hours to complete the event.

The odo check traveled through Washington Park, past the Rose Garden, by the Oregon Zoo, then west on Hwy 26 to end at Rock Creek Park. From there the rally route continued west through Helvetia, out Skyline, and down Rocky Point Road to Hwy 30. Then the course headed out onto the Scappoose Dike, to a break at the Scappoose Airport county park.

After the break the rally route headed up into them thar hills overlooking the Columbia River, eventually traveling through Yankton and Warren, before arriving at the finish in St. Helens.

Challenges

This year's Ghouls Gambol Rally promised some tricks as well as treats, and it delivered. A rally trick (aka trap) is a planned opportunity to earn penalty points.

The first rally trick planned for this event was a number switch – presenting route instructions out of numerical order – which would have resulted in rally cars traveling through a loop, some in one direction and some in the other. Only one direction was on course. But the rally gods removed a road identification sign essential to the trap. The missing sign was noticed prior to the event, and emergency route instructions were issued to remove the peril. Oh, well. So it goes. One down, plenty more to come.

The second challenge, a main road trap, lured teams to use a route instruction that followed the main road. The instruction was to go right at a sign. At the first intersection encountered with that sign present, the main road goes right by protection (back-facing stop signs). You cannot use the instruction there; so you proceed to the next intersection, where the sign is also present and where you can go

right because the main road goes straight. Easy peasy.

The third challenge was set up in an OR instruction where the first half of the OR offered a pause at a STOP and the second half of the OR offered a pause of a different duration at a particular sign. You do come to a stop sign, but it is at a railroad crossing with no road intersection, so it does not meet the definition of a STOP. The correct action is to pass that up and pause at the sign in the second half of the OR instruction.



Next is another main road challenge, presented a bit differently than the previous one. An ITIS instruction with a pause is offered at an intersection where the instruction would

take you in the same direction as the main road by protection. The correct action here is to skip the

ITIS and its penalty pause.

And just in case you were not paying attention, the next challenge is another main road protection challenge set up by an ITIS instruction with a pause. This time, however, the ITIS instruction can be used because it does NOT follow the main road, so the correct action is to use the ITIS and its pause. See – you can't always just skip the ITIS and its pause.

But wait! There's more! A note is introduced which directs a speed reduction of 5 mph at each sign reading "XING". You do see a sign that's similar, but not quite right. "When quoted, a sign will be exact with respect to spelling, punctuation..." An opportunity to correctly use the note is never encountered.

For the final trick before the treats, a route instruction directed you to CAST 35 for one minute and then CAST 25. The next instruction directed a left on a specific road name. If you were accurate, you traveled 0.583 miles in one minute at CAST 35. If you got impatient and took the first left on the named road, then you arrived at the checkpoint too early and saw the on course cars waving at you as they traveled this loop in the opposite direction.

November 18 – Oregon Trailblazer Rally

By the time this newsletter is published, the Nov. 18 Oregon Trailblazer Rally – aka The Beaver Cleaver – will be in the books.

This tricky TSD rally was designed to challenge driving and navigational skills. The 100-mile rally route was mostly paved, with less than five miles of fine Oregon gravel.

A small but dedicated field of teams dodged off course route controls in pursuit of the on course route. It was the most challenging event in the Cascade Geargrinders 2023 schedule.

The first Oregon Trailblazer Rally was May 13-14, 1961. The last known prior offering was May 13, 2006. It was offered annually and then sporadically over the intervening years. Hopefully this year's revival will encourage future Geargrinders organizers to offer this trick-and-trap style event on a regular basis.
