

Minutes were approved unanimously for the January board meeting.

Webmistress: Great job on new website!!!!!!

Treasurer: We have money. The audit was done earlier today and the signed report is in. Everything was okay. We lost around \$11,000 on the races this year. Hopefully it will get better this coming race season.

Enduro Chairman: Chris presented his budget for The Festival of Endurance. There was one small change to the budget we received but we approved his budget unanimously.

Marketing: Linda asked about how we were to proceed with the Trifold. There is one spot where we mention ". . .safe and controlled environment. . . ". Chris did some research and found we should not use that work Safe because it implies a legal problem. The board discussed this and we voted to unanimously scrap the remaining Trifolds and print new ones without that wording.

For the MHRC we have a space large enough to show five cars. Now to get those cars and the people to help with the display.

Cascade is organizing an annual tech inspection for ICSCC cars to be staged at PIR on March 23 with the TC Drivers school and TnT. Brian will get the information and stickers we need from Conference. We need to obtain the roll bar stamp in case we have some new cars. The Board unanimously approved for Brian to spend \$200 to get a steward down for this, if needed.

Race Chairman: We are checking to see where all of the keys are to the trucks, trailers and radio safe. At this time Mike, Brian, Adam and PIR have radio safe keys. We will check on the rest. Adam has two sets for all the trucks and there is one at PIR.

We discussed buying a sound speaker for the Race Chair and Drivers training to use at outside meetings.

The Carport for the trucks at PIR is up. They were unable to drill into the ground for stacks so Mike is getting four 800 pound blocks to anchor the canopy.

Membership: We have five new members to announce at the general meeting. We also will delete Marge Creitz and Linda Brown from the Lifetime memberships.

PROPOSED Policy and Procedure CHANGES

These changes, originally presented October 7, 2023, and voted on at the November 2023 General meeting, will have a **CONFIRMATION vote on March 2, 2024** at the CSCC General monthly Meeting.

Meeting minutes from November 2023 do reflect a vote, however, more clarification needs to be made.

Current ByLaws

Free Membership Qualifications

New and existing members (except ICSCC completion license holders), if you work at least five (5) full days (8 hrs + per day) at any of the following events, you are eligible to receive a free Cascade Sports Car

Club membership for the following year.

Eligible CSCC events include:

Rose City Opener club race (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday)

Chicane Challenge club race (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday)

The Dash club race (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday)

Any Saturday Series Rally (Rally-Master counts as 5 days per event)

Mountains to the Sea Rally (Rally-Master counts as 10 days. Precheck counts as 1 day).

Ghouls Gambol rally (Rally-Master counts as 5 days)

Cascade Enduro (October Saturday)

PROPOSED re-wording of above By-Law (Oct 7, 2023)

Each year, individuals who volunteer to CSCC a minimum of 45 hours are eligible to receive a free

Cascade Sports Car Club membership for the following year. Hours volunteered at any Cascade club

race, driver training, Rally event, or Cascade Only supported race (*i.e., SVRA*) are eligible. Additionally, hours volunteered by the board of directors, committee chairs and their assistants shall also be considered eligible; however, only those hours which directly relate to their duties or obligations shall be counted.

The original October 23, 2023 publication date of these *Policy and Procedure* changes, inaccurately identified as a By-law, served as notice to the membership. Voting on this change took place at the November 4, 2023 General Meeting. Membership will be asked to consider an additional proposed change at the MARCH 2, 2024 GENERAL MEETING.

Cascade Sports Car Club's "FREE PIZZA NIGHT"

Outside of an end of day social, it's not that common to see a group of three dozen or so race car drivers and race volunteers laughing, talking and swapping stories. On Saturday, February 3, at Stark Street Pizza in Portland, the monthly Cascade Sports Car Club General Meeting, members of the Board of Directors, Volunteers and drivers did just that.

Oh, and let's not forget about the free pizza!

The atmosphere was light, and collegial, even when the discussion turned to more weighty matters.

The board discussed the need for volunteers to man a booth at the 39th annual Roadster Show, held March 15-17 at the Portland Expo Center. Show hours are Friday 12-9 pm, Saturday 10 am to 8 pm, and Sunday 10 am to 5 pm. Volunteers receive a pass to the show for the day they volunteer, but parking is not included. Chris Heinrich, CSCC member, has volunteered at the Roadster Show in the past.

"You get to see all the cool cars and talk to people, share about the club with people," he said.

Race Chair Mike Smith provided an update on a new canopy erected in the south paddock to cover and protect the safety trucks. CSCC and the local chapter of the Sports Car Club of America partnered up to fund the new shelter, which included reconfiguring the gates to make it easier to park the trucks.

"The sun", Smith said, "is notorious for causing red paint to fade, and the canopy will help prevent damage and protect the vehicles from inclement weather. The structure was installed on January 11, and the new gates on January 22," he added.

Robert Paxman, CSCC vice president, had been tasked with updating and digitizing the CSCC bylaws, when he was tapped to help give the Club's charity bylaws a facelift as well.



Paxman added a table of contents, cleaned up the formatting, and with input from the board of directors, brought the text up to date.

The results were so good that Linda Blackburn CSCC secretary, asked Paxman to sync the formatting and editing style of the Charity Bylaws to its CSCC counterpart.

Cascade is two organizations, he explained, the race organization, and a charity, each with it's own set of bylaws. "Touch ups to both were needed," Paxman said. The idea for updating the bylaws will focus on syncing the formatting and editing style of the pamphlet with its CSCC counterpart.

The charity was originally formed to raise money for Doernbecher Hospital through the *Doernbecher Dash*. About a decade ago the event was renamed Dash for Kids, a race event held once a year at PIR.

Featuring rides in race cars by licensed race car drivers and a silent auction, the event raised funds for a variety of children's charities, Now called The Dash, the charity aims to help a broader spectrum of charitable organizations in the greater Portland area.

In addition, the issue of the rules for sound levels at PIR, and how violations should be handled, was a lively topic. Brett McKown, HPDE Chairperson, said discussion centered on getting better clarity from the PIR track management office regarding how their sound violation process should be interpreted for CSCC events.

Sound rules are spelled out in PIR's track policies, Heinrich said. Less clear is how events and CSCC weekends are defined.

The issue was tabled for now, due to the need for more information. ~~Schellene

Remembering Jeff Menor By Kevin Smith I first met Jeff at the February 2020 TC General meeting. Tim Jorgensen introduced us. Jeff had just bought Tim's Gen4 (1993?) Camaro American Sedan race car and was intending to get his license and start racing. Tim is a longtime friend and competitor in the American Sedan class, and I was happy that his car had been sold to someone locally to help keep the class alive. Jeff seemed like a super nice guy, and his excitement about racing was so good to see. Well, as we all remember, 2020 wasn't a great year for racing. I think Jeff couldn't get his license until 2021. I saw Jeff very little more in 2020. When TC started to have general meetings again, I would see Jeff at the general meetings and we talked quite a bit about our cars, what Jeff had been doing to prep and run his car, and we got along really well. At the banquet in January of 2022, we talked a lot about running American Sedan, and what Jeff's car needed to be faster and more competitive. We also urged/goaded Eric Howell on buying John Risbberger's American Sedan Camaro to get another racer out there with us. During the 2022 season, Jeff and I paddocked together at most of the Portland ICSCC races. Jeff would get to the track and save paddock spaces early on Friday morning, I would arrive middle of Friday afternoon, and we'd set up our paddock areas Friday afternoon, and get cars ready during early evening Friday. I really enjoyed being paddocked with Jeff and helping him out when I could and just generally shooting the BS with him when we weren't hustling to get car work done. Jeff had cooling issues with his car for much of 2022, so

he had some trouble finishing races, but he didn't let that stop him from enjoying himself, or having fun while he was at the track. Later in the 2022 season he asked me to be a driver coach for him at a track day in his beastly Camaro ZL1, and we had a blast that day and I think I helped him get a bit faster. We kept in touch all through the winter of 2022/2023 talking about racing, but also working on bylaws changes since Jeff had volunteered to be TC vice president in 2023. I visited his shop at Basic Fire protection several times that winter to look over his race car and see how they had made the windshield wipers work, and to help me figure out what they were using to control rear wheel hop. I got my wipers working, engineering it similar to Jeff's car, and appreciated the openness with which we each showed whatever we thought might help the other. During the 2023 race season, Jeff and I paddocked together at all the conference races that we both attended. We paddocked together at the April race weekend at PIR, then again at the June races at Pacific Raceways in miserably rainy and wet weather on Saturday, and slightly better weather on Sunday. And we paddocked together at the June races at PIR. No matter the weather, those weekends were all better with Jeff's presence. Unfortunately, at the July races at Pacific Rceways on Saturday, the engine in Jeff's Camaro broke, ending his weekend, and his racing season. Jeff was also very active in Team Continental's track days, helping out how he could, and often running his white ZL1 Camaro in the time trials. I've left out a lot of things, but bottom line, Jeff was a fun guy to be around, whether at the track, at a general meeting, or at an after track social event. He was a great guy, a great competitor and a great friend. He will be missed by myself, and many others, and by TC. More Pacific Northwest Rally News

Want more TSD rally? The Northwest Rally Council (NWRC) has announced their 2024 rally schedule. They plan to offer six Friday Nighters: April 12, May 10, June 14, July 12, Sept. 13 and Oct. 11. The start location is Eastgate Park and Ride in Bellevue, WA. Registration opens at 6:45 pm with a drivers meeting at 7:15 pm. First car starts at 7:31 pm. NWRC's Friday Nighter Series will offer Novice and SOP championships.

Also on NWRC's 2024 schedule are Rainier's Raindrop and No Alibi touring rallies. Raindrop, on May 5, is always a nice Sunday drive. This year Raindrop runs northwest of Seattle, starting in Duvall and finishing in Stanwood. No Alibi, June 1-2, is a two-day romp using many fine paved and unpaved roads. This year, No Alibi will be headquartered in Pendleton, OR.

NWRC is a group of separate clubs in the Seattle area. Although they introduced Richta GPS Checkpoints last season, not all of their clubs adopted the new-fangled scoring system. This season, more (maybe most?) of the NWRC rallies will use Richta. They've updated their Rally Rules (aka Generals) to include Richta scoring.

A bit closer to home is the <u>Alfa Romeo Owners of Oregon</u> (AROO) Rally Cup Series. They offer a four-event series of Sunday morning TSD rallies, starting from the French Prairie Rest Area (on I-5 south of Tigard), on March 10, April 7, May 5 and June 9. The drivers meeting is at 9:45 am with first car out at 10:01 am. They offer a free rally school on March 9 from 9 am to noon at Langers Entertainment Center in Sherwood. <u>Preregistration</u> is required for all AROO events. AROO is also starting to use Richta. Their rules are currently being updated to support the Richta GPS timing system.



Feb. 17 Rally School

Twenty-one teams entered Cascade Sports Car Club's Feb. 16-17 Rally School. The Friday-evening virtual rally school was followed on Saturday by a just-for-practice road rally.

About the rally school


Friday evening's virtual rally school meeting covered a lot of information, starting with a tour of the <u>Cascade</u> <u>Geargrinders</u> website. What is a road rally, how do you begin a rally, what is the odometer calibration section, how do you use the Richta app, and what do you do at a checkpoint? And we hadn't even gotten to how to interpret route instructions yet. Best to learn how to stay on course before worrying about staying on time. It does not help to be on time if you are in the wrong place.

Understanding the syntax of rally route instructions, familiarity with rally terms such as intersection and deviation, and discerning between reference to a sign, a landmark or a defined term were all covered. Rally roads are always paved – no gravel roads. Rally roads are always through roads – no dead-ends, no u-turns.

Tips for staying on time were provided, and how to recognize and avoid tricks and traps was also covered. A bit of time was hurriedly spent on Main Road concepts, and examples of how to use Time Allowances to advantage were provided. It was a lot to cover in two hours.

About the rally

The Rally School rally was about 100 miles from the start in northwest Portland to the ending location in Forest Grove. It took a bit over three hours to complete the event. There was a mid-rally break at the Fernhill Wetlands. The route included a drive around Hagg Lake.

The event was not without unplanned challenges. Development was delayed by snow. The "final" checkout was interrupted by flooded roads. When we finally were able to complete the checkout a few days before the rally, we discovered a temporary traffic signal had appeared, controlling one-way traffic across the dam at Hagg Lake, just a short distance before the final checkpoint. That leg had to be discarded. And it wasn't the last.

Then on rally day, with no snow and no flooding, the rally route was impacted by a road closure due to a fallen tree. Thank you to Dave and JoAnn Gattman for adventuring past the road closure sign to find out why the road was closed and a gold star to Russ and Kate Sherrell for staying at the road closure to hold up rally cars until we could get an emergency broadcast out in the Richta app to all the teams, providing emergency route instructions to avoid the road closure. We lost three scored legs to that tree. Then checkpoint 12 disappeared. It was there on our final checkout. But on rally day, it just wasn't. That caused another three legs to be thrown out. Whew! Murphy played havoc. But the rallyists persevered and the event concluded with fourteen scored legs.

Challenges

There were a few planned challenges. The first offered an optional pause at a STOP at a railroad crossing. Since STOP is a defined term meaning "an intersection at which the contestant is legally obligated to stop" and since there is no intersection (meeting of rally roads at which the contestant could proceed in more than one direction) at a railroad crossing, the correct action was to refuse the optional pause.

The second challenge directed that you change your average speed for one mile. But then what? The rules say you revert to the previously directed average speed.

The third and fourth challenges were Main Road traps, offering an optional deviation (with a pause of course) that you should refuse because they went the same direction as the Main Road.

The final challenge was a note directing you to pause at the second TRICERATOPS, a term we defined with a supplemental rule including a photo. Thing is there is only one (and even that's surprising). But the route looped around and went by the Jurassic statue twice, so that's when you were supposed to execute the note and pause.

What ralliers said

We enjoyed our 1st rally. We learned a lot but have a long way to go.

Thanks for another nice rally day. Sorry about the storm messing up your rally plans. Darn fallen trees.

Thank you so much, it was a lot of fun.

Thank you for your hard work on today's rally. We are sorry we couldn't finish it. Next time we will use my car. [Car #18 had car trouble but were able to limp home to Albany.]

Races are one hour or two hours in length. Two hour races count as two races (single points times 2). Note: Time does not stop for black flags or red flags

Top 6 races count towards the points championship. Must enter a minimum of five races in order to qualify for the championship. With one 2 hour race, there is a total of 9 races.

Each one hour entry shall consist of one or two drivers. Each two hour entry may have no more than four drivers. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race.

Each one hour race will require a mandatory 60 second pit stop. Each two hour race will require a mandatory two minute pit stop.

Entry fee, qualifying procedure, etc. will be determined by sponsoring club and may be different between events.

Classes: ME0 – AP, SPO, SPM, GT1, GT2, GT3, ITE, ST, SST ME1 – BP, EIP, FIP, GTL, RS, AS, SE46, SPU, P1 ME2 – CP, DP, PRO3, ITS, PRO44, HIP, CT4, P2 ME3 – EP, FP, GP, CR, PRO7, SM, CSM, HT, ITA, ITB, ITC, P3 MSR – SPORTS RACER CLASS (Open to ICSCC eligible Sports Racers)

Production classes (P1 – P3) – Open modifications as allowed per ICSCC Competition Regulations. Cars are classed by horsepower (HP) and weight to horsepower (WT:HP). If horsepower and WT:HP are in different classes, the Race Steward shall determine the class. P1- 180 to 225HP, 12.0-15.5 WT:HP; P2- 135 to 180HP, 15.5-19.0 WT:HP; P3- below 135HP, above 19.0 WT:HP. HP is determined using a Dynojet dynamometer 248/224/424 utilizing standard practices and procedures as described in the ST rules and as outlined in Section 1324.H of the ICSCC Competition Regs. A dyno form is not required. WT is minimum race weight with driver. Cars with lap times significantly outside of the typical sub-class range for a class may be reclassified by the Race Steward. ICSCC sub-classes listed shall follow class rules.

Points: 1st - 12, 2nd - 10, 3rd - 9, 4th - 8, 5th - 7, 6th - 6, 7th - 5, 8th - 4, 9th - 3, 10th & lower - 2, Pole - 1 (where applicable / No pole points for 2 hour races). All positions are scored except as noted: DNF/DNS score a maximum of 6th place points. Number of laps completed will determine position for DNF's. All DNS's score the same number of points based on the number of cars in class.

Championship trophies will be awarded to class champions in classes that average 0.75 entries. Championship trophies will be awarded to the top 3 in classes that average 5 entries.

Eligibility: Licenses – ICSCC IRR/ ARR/ ENDURO, SCCA, CACC, SOVREN, FIA, ASN, or NASA. All other licenses must be approved by the ICSCC License Director.

FULL SET OF RULES:

Entry to this race does **not** have to be in conjunction with any other race(s) of the weekend.

Except as noted, the 2024 ICSCC Competition Regulations will apply.

Classes follow ICSCC class rules except for the Production class (P1-P3) which is not an ICSCC class. Production cars should resemble factory production cars and shall follow guidelines outlined on page 1.

Maximum number of drivers per race: 1 Hour Races – two. 2 Hour Races – four. Teams may petition the Race Steward to have additional drivers. Drivers on teams that use more than the maximum number of drivers will receive full points if the driver has driven a minimum of fifteen minutes. In all other cases a driver must drive in the race to score points unless the car DNF's. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race. Where a driver is found racing without registering, the team will at a minimum be disqualified.

Car numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Points: See above (page 1) for point structure. Each driver will receive the same points whether an entry is one or multiple drivers. Example: If a one driver entry wins – 12 points are awarded. If a two driver entry wins – 12 points are awarded to each driver. Pole points will be awarded to both drivers. If a driver drives in two different cars in the same race, they will only receive points for the higher finish if the two cars are in the same class. If the two cars are in different classes, the driver will receive points for both classes. The Series Championship (each class) will be determined by adding a driver's six highest point totals together. Ties in final points shall be resolved on the basis of each driver's record of first place finishes; then, if necessary, second place finishes. If two or more drivers have accumulated the same number of first and second place finishes, they shall be considered tied for the Championship. If for example two drivers tie for the Championship, the next driver shall be considered to have finished in third place.

Mandatory Pit Stop: Each one hour race will have a mandatory 60 second pit stop to be made between the 20 minute mark and the 40 minute mark of the race for both one driver and two driver entries. Each two hour race will have a mandatory two minute pit stop to be made between the 30 minute mark and the 90 minute mark of the race for both one driver and multiple driver entries. Pit stops may be made before or after the mandatory pit window but will not count towards the mandatory pit stop. The car's ignition must be turned off while refueling as well as when a driver change is taking place. All crew members who have the potential to come into direct contact with gasoline or gasoline vapors during pit stops are required to wear the following safety gear: A fire suit, fire resistant gloves, head sock, and helmet. A fire bottle designee is also required in case of a fire; however, they are not required to wear the same safety gear. No contact with the car is allowed while refueling except for a driver change. Helping a driver get belted in, radios plugged in, and cleaning the front windshield are not considered contact with the car and may occur at the time of refueling if necessary. Pit crew attire: Arms, legs, and feet shall be fully covered.

The Pit lane speed limit and zones shall be determined by the sponsoring club. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into their pit space. During a Full Course Yellow (FCY), pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a FCY, you will be released to rejoin the field. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the re-start of the race. If a FCY or Black/Red flag extends past

the mandatory pit window, two green flag laps will be added to the pit window. The clock will continue to run under race stoppage.

Minimum Penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 1 liter – Stop & Go. Improper attire on crew members over the wall, no fire bottle designee – Penalty Box: 30 seconds. Working on car during re-fueling – Penalty Box: 1 minute. Mandatory pit stop window violation: 2 lap penalty (1 hour races), 3 lap penalty (2 hour races). All others – Warning

Trophies: One or two in class - 1st only; three to five in class - 1st & 2nd; six or more - 1st, 2nd, 3rd

MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING – See schedule. Failure to attend may result in starting at the rear of the field.

Each sponsoring club is responsible for setting the qualifying procedure. Qualifying sessions may vary from what is listed below. Check event schedule for the most up to date information.

ICSCC International Road Race "Gold" licenses require a corresponding one or two year ICSCC Member or Associate club membership and a completed physical form (found here-<u>https://www.icscc.com/forms.php</u>

ICSCC Area Road Race "Silver" licenses also require a corresponding one or two year ICCSCC Member or Affiliate club membership but do not require a physical.

Also available in one and two year durations are:

ICSCC Observation Licenses if our License Director deems that you have enough experience to bypass the Novice program but are new to us so we can watch and evaluate with the same Club and Medical requirements as above.

ICSCC Novice Licenses if you have completed an acceptable driver training event and joined a club and completed your Medical requirements as above.

WEEKEND TOURNAMENT & CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

WHAT IS IT: A 3 weekend, 9 race series for Production cars, Formula cars, and Sports Racers that are at least 20 years old.

2024 SCHEDULE: (1) April 27 - 28 @ PIR, (2) June 15-16 @ PIR, (3) August 10-11 @ PIR

CLASSES: PO – Production cars w/open modifications (engine swaps/aero) P1 – Production cars 1999cc and under, P2 – Production cars 2000cc – 2999cc, P3 – Production cars 3000cc – 3999cc, P4 – Production cars 4000cc and over, F – Formula cars, SR – Sports Racers. Turbocharged or Supercharged cars multiply displacement by a factor of 1.4 Rotary powered cars: 12A - P2 13B - P3

POINTS, WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS, AND SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP:

<u>PER RACE</u> – Earn 1 point for each race lap completed plus 4 bonus points for 1^{st} in class, 3 bonus points for 2^{nd} in class, and 2 bonus points for 3^{rd} in class.

Points from all three races of the weekend will be added together to determine the **WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS** for each class.

Trophies will be awarded based on the number of cars in class: 1-2 cars in class -1^{st} only, 3-5 cars in class -1^{st} and 2^{nd} , 6 or more cars in class -1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} .

The **SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP** for each class will be determined by adding the points from a driver's best 7 races together. Ties will be determined by the number of 1^{st} place finishes. Must enter a minimum of 6 races (two weekends) in order to qualify for the Nostalgic Series Championship.

Championship trophies will be awarded as follows: To the class champion in classes that average at least 1 entry (9 total class entries for the series) and to the top three in classes that average at least 4 entries (36 total class entries for the series).

THIS IS A STRICT <u>NO CONTACT</u> SERIES WHERE THE GOAL IS TO HAVE FUN WHILE SHOWCASING SENTIMENTAL CARS FROM THE PAST. MINIMUM PENALTIES FOR AT FAULT CONTACT ARE PROBATION FOR THE REST OF THE SERIES UP TO SUSPENSION FROM THE SERIES FOR ONE YEAR. IF WHILE ON PROBATION A DRIVER HAS CONTACT, THEY WILL BE IMMEDIATELY EXCLUDED FROM THE SERIES FOR A MINIMUM OF 13 MONTHS, LOSE ALL POINTS, AND BECOME INELIGIBLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

SAFETY:

ICSCC minimum safety standards as set forth in Section 11 of the current year ICSCC Competition Regulations shall apply. Cars that meet Vintage racing organization's standards may be accepted with proof that the car has been approved to race by those organizations.

MODIFICATIONS:

There shall be no minimum weight for the Nostalgic Series thus no need to scale after the races.

Production class cars shall fit the spirit of "Production" cars thus modifications should be similar to those allowed in ICSCC Improved Production classes (SCCA Production). Most current ICSCC classes other than most GT, SP, and ITE cars are considered within the spirit of Production cars. Cars such as the Caterham 7 and Factory Five Roadster fit into the spirit of the Nostalgic Series. Furthermore, the Cascade Competition Board reserves the right to include any car into the series they feel meets the spirit of the series.

TIRES:

Production cars shall run on DOT approved tires. Sports Racers and Formula cars may run on slicks.

DRIVER CONDUCT:

This is racing; however, car to car contact will not be tolerated. Drivers are expected to leave racing room and to be aware of their surroundings. They should avoid contact whenever possible. There is the potential for a wide disparity of speed and types of cars so situational awareness is paramount.

GRIDDING FOR RACES:

Qualifying times will be used to set the grid for race one (fastest first to slowest last). The grids for subsequent races will be set using a driver's fastest lap time from the previous race (fastest first to slowest last). See Split Starts below.

SPLIT STARTS:

Production classes and Sports Racers/Formula classes will utilize a split start for each race. The Race Steward has sole discretion over which group starts first and will take into consideration the number of cars in each of the classes as well as lap times.
