

CSCC RACE VOLUNTEER GUIDELINES AND BENEFITS FOR 2025



These benefits are for a full day (8hrs+) of volunteering at a specialty.

LOCAL TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

- Every volunteer that works Friday Driver's School/HPDE/TNT will receive \$10 travel money. This includes those that
 will be receiving long-distance travel for the weekend. This money will be handed out on Friday morning at
 registration.
- All volunteers (<u>other than those that receive long-distance travel reimbursement</u>), that sign up and work on both days, Saturday and Sunday, will receive \$15 in cash for local travel. This money will be handed out on Sunday morning at registration.

LONG-DISTANCE TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT GUIDELINES

Those entitled to Travel Reimbursement must sign up on MotorsportsReg. Long-distance travel reimbursement will be provided to eligible volunteers via check by the conclusion of the race weekend. Please see volunteer registrar for specific timing during the event weekend.

- All Volunteers that travel 50 to 99 miles will be given \$50.
- All volunteers that travel 100 to 199 miles will be given \$100.
- All volunteers that travel 200 plus miles will be given \$150.
- Long Distance Travel is for a two-day weekend, Saturday and Sunday.
- Long Distance Travel reimbursement is for CSCC events only. Not events that CSCC supports. (e.g. NASCAR, Formula E, Rose Cup, SVRA, and IndyCar)

ADDITIONAL BENEFITS

- A \$15 gift card each day of the race weekend, Saturday and Sunday, with your choice of Fred Meyer/Safeway -or- a
 voucher for lunch from the Concession stand. Voucher for Concession stand is \$15. This will be handed out each day
 at morning registration.
- Three (3) Beverage Tickets for the weekend. All three tickets will be given out on Saturday.
- If dinner is provided on Saturday evening, the dinner is free for all volunteers.

YEAR-END BENEFITS

- There will be a drawing at the end of the season, probably at the October Enduro. Winners of the drawing will not be required to be at the event.
 - Every volunteer will receive a drawing ticket for each day they work. Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The tickets will be put into the drawing bucket. This will be done for every CSCC race and Enduro. When we have the drawing, a person will win only once. All names will be in the bucket for the top prize. The dollar amount and how many will be determined by the money received from the "Worker Fund Donations".
- A free CSCC Awards Social dinner ticket for any volunteer who works 5 or more full days at CSCC events.

FREE MEMBERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

Each year, individuals who volunteer to CSCC a minimum of 45 hours are eligible to receive a free Cascade Sports Car Club membership for the following year. Hours volunteered at any Cascade club race, driver training, Rally event, or Cascade Only supported race (i.e., SVRA) are eligible. Additionally, hours volunteered by the board of directors, committee chairs and their assistants shall also be considered eligible; however, only those hours which directly relate to their duties or obligations shall be counted.






Races are one hour or two hours in length. Two hour races count as two races (single points times 2). Note: Time does not stop for black flags or red flags

Top 6 races count towards the points championship. Must enter a minimum of five races in order to qualify for the championship. With one 2 hour race, there are a total of 9 races.

Each one hour entry shall consist of one or two drivers. Each two hour entry may have no more than four drivers. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race.

Each one hour race will require a mandatory 60 second pit stop. Each two hour race will require a mandatory two minute pit stop.

Entry fee, qualifying procedure, etc. will be determined by sponsoring club and may be different between events.

Classes: ME0 – SPO, SPM, SPU, GT1, GT2, GT3, ITE, ST, SST

ME1 - EIP, FIP, GTL, AS, SE46, ST1, P1

ME2 - PRO3, ITS, PRO44, HIP, CT4, ST2, ST3, P2

ME3 - SM, CSM, CR, PRO7, HT, ITA, ITB, ITC, ST4, ST5, P3

MSR – SPORTS RACER CLASS (Open to ICSCC eligible Sports Racers)

Production classes (P1 – P3) – Open modifications as allowed per ICSCC Competition Regulations. Cars are classed by horsepower (HP) and weight to horsepower (WT:HP). If horsepower and WT:HP are in different classes, the Race Steward shall determine the class. P1- 185 to 245HP, 12.0-15.5 WT:HP; P2- 135 to 185HP, 15.5-19.0 WT:HP; P3- below 135HP, above 19.0 WT:HP. HP is determined using a Dynojet dynamometer 248/224/424 utilizing standard practices and procedures as described in the ST rules and as outlined in Section 1321.H of the ICSCC Competition Regs. A dyno form is not required. WT is minimum race weight with driver. Cars racing on 180 or above treadwear tires may deduct 1.0 from their WT:HP ratio if meeting the P1 – P3 specifications. Cars with lap times significantly outside of the typical sub-class range for a class may be reclassified by the Race Steward. ICSCC sub-classes listed shall follow class rules.

Points: 1st - 12, 2nd - 10, 3rd - 9, 4th - 8, 5th - 7, 6th - 6, 7th - 5, 8th - 4, 9th - 3, 10th & lower - 2, Pole - 1 (where applicable / No pole points for 2 hour races). All positions are scored except as noted: DNF/DNS score a maximum of 6th place points. Number of laps completed will determine position for DNF's. All DNS's score the same number of points based on the number of cars in class.

Championship trophies will be awarded to class champions in classes that average 0.75 entries. Championship trophies will be awarded to the top 3 in classes that average 5 entries.

Eligibility: Licenses – ICSCC IRR/ ARR/ ENDURO, SCCA, CACC, SOVREN, FIA, ASN, or NASA. All other licenses must be approved by the ICSCC License Director.

FULL SET OF RULES:

Entry to this race does **not** have to be in conjunction with any other race(s) of the weekend.

Except as noted, the 2025 ICSCC Competition Regulations will apply.

Classes follow ICSCC class rules except for the Production class (P1-P3) which is not an ICSCC class. Production cars should resemble factory production cars and shall follow guidelines outlined on page 1.

Maximum number of drivers per race: 1 Hour Races – two. 2 Hour Races – four. Teams may petition the Race Steward to have additional drivers. Drivers on teams that use more than the maximum number of drivers will receive full points if the driver has driven a minimum of fifteen minutes. In all other cases a driver must drive in the race to score points unless the car DNF's. Drivers may drive in up to two cars per race. Where a driver is found racing without registering, the team will at a minimum be disqualified.

Car numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Points: See above (page 1) for point structure. Each driver will receive the same points whether an entry is one or multiple drivers. Example: If a one driver entry wins – 12 points are awarded. If a two driver entry wins – 12 points are awarded to each driver. Pole points will be awarded to both drivers. If a driver drives in two different cars in the same race, they will only receive. points for the higher finish if the two cars are in the same class. If the two cars are in different classes, the driver will receive points for both classes. The Series Championship (each class) will be determined by adding a driver's six highest point totals together. Ties in final points shall be resolved on the basis of each driver's record of first place finishes; then, if necessary, second place finishes. If two or more drivers have accumulated the same number of first and second place finishes, they shall be considered tied for the Championship. If two drivers tie for the Championship, the next driver shall be considered to have finished in third place.

Mandatory Pit Stop: Each one hour race will have a mandatory 60 second pit stop to be made between the 20 minute mark and the 40 minute mark of the race for both one driver and two driver entries. Each two hour race will have a mandatory two minute pit stop to be made between the 30 minute mark and the 90 minute mark of the race for both one driver and multiple driver entries. Pit stops may be made before or after the mandatory pit window but will not count towards the mandatory pit stop. The car's ignition must be turned off while refueling as well as when a driver change is taking place. All crew members who have the potential to come into direct contact with gasoline or gasoline vapors during pit stops are required to wear the following safety gear: A fire suit, fire resistant gloves, head sock, and helmet. A fire bottle designee is also required in case of a fire; however, they are not required to wear the same safety gear. No contact with the car is allowed while refueling except for a driver change. Helping a driver get belted in, radios plugged in, and cleaning the front windshield are not considered contact with the car and may occur at the time of refueling if necessary. Pit crew attire: Arms, legs, and feet shall be fully covered.

> The Pit lane speed limit and zones shall be determined by the sponsoring club. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into their pit space. During a Full Course Yellow (FCY), pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a FCY, you will be released to rejoin the field. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the re-start of the race. If a FCY or Black/Red flag extends past the mandatory pit window, two green flag laps will be added to the pit window. The clock will continue to run under race stoppage.

Minimum Penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 1 liter – Stop & Go. Improper attire on crew members over the wall, no fire bottle designee – Penalty Box: 30 seconds. Working on car during re-fueling – Penalty Box: 1 minute. Mandatory pit stop window violation: 2 lap penalty (1 hour races), 3 lap penalty (2 hour races). All others – Warning

Trophies: One or two in class -1^{st} only; three to five in class -1^{st} & 2^{nd} ; six or more -1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd}

MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING – See schedule. Failure to attend may result in starting at the rear of the field.

Each sponsoring club is responsible for setting the qualifying procedure. Qualifying sessions may vary from what is listed below. Check event schedule for the most up to date information.

QUALIFYING PROCEDURES

Report from #47

I have a vast supply of bloopers and goof-ups to draw on, so I thought I would provide another installment of my key learnings from my prior mistakes. I think most of the racers in my run group already know I screw up, so I'm hoping I don't get shunned for sharing my mistakes with the rest of you. If you already know the things I have learned, then maybe you can view this as the comic relief section of the newsletter. If you think my novice-racer learnings are mundane, please drop me a note and I'll strive to adapt.



Incident: During qualifying on 6-15-24 at PIR T1, an unexpected loss of control of the Formula Mazda (FM) car ahead resulted in a T-bone near miss at T2. Video clip of the close call can be found here: http://youtu.be/c-L5Rrgn78

<u>Root Cause:</u> The cause of the spin for the FM was likely cold tires (it was only the opening hot lap, and qualifying is in the cooler morning hours, etc.), but I don't want to speak for the driver of the FM. The cause of the close call was my failure to anticipate and correctly respond to the situation unfolding ahead of me.

<u>Key Learnings:</u> Unless your car is upside-down, if it is moving then you are still driving. The FM driver did a good job of using the last bit of inertia to roll the car off the line to give me a gap.

I learned that I was treating qualifying in a more nonchalant way since it's not wheel-to-wheel racing. Qualifying is not a HPDE joy ride where I'm striving to set a decent lap time. It is still serious on-track competitive driving. In addition, I had opportunity to dump my car over the curbing of the chicane to the left of the FM to assure safe avoidance (maybe at some undercarriage cost), but I was overly fixated on staying on the flat asphalt. To have the outcome in my own hands, I should have bailed over the left curb so as to not leave our mutual fate to the final swerve of the FM.

Turbocharged or Supercharged cars multiply displacement by a factor of 1.4 Rotary powered cars: 12A – P2 13B – P3

POINTS, WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS, AND SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP:

<u>PER RACE</u> – Earn 1 point for each race lap completed plus 4 bonus points for 1st in class, 3 bonus points for 2nd in class, and 2 bonus points for 3rd in class.

Points from all three races of the weekend will be added together to determine the **WEEKEND TOURNAMENT WINNERS** for each class.

Trophies will be awarded based on the number of cars in class: 1-2 cars in class -1^{st} only, 3-5 cars in class -1^{st} and 2^{nd} , 6 or more cars in class -1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} .

The **SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP** for each class will be determined by adding the points from a driver's best 7 races together. Ties will be determined by the number of 1st place finishes. Must enter a minimum of 6 races (two weekends) in order to qualify for the Nostalgic Series Championship.

Championship trophies will be awarded as follows: To the class champion in classes that average at least 1 entry (9 total class entries for the series) and to the top three in classes that average at least 4 entries (36 total class entries for the series).

THIS IS A STRICT <u>NO CONTACT</u> SERIES WHERE THE GOAL IS TO HAVE FUN WHILE SHOWCASING SENTIMENTAL CARS FROM THE PAST. THE MINIMUM PENALTY FOR AT FAULT CONTACT IS PROBATION FOR 12 MONTHS. IF WHILE ON PROBATION A DRIVER HAS CONTACT, THEY WILL BE IMMEDIATELY EXCLUDED FROM THE SERIES FOR A MINIMUM OF 13 MONTHS, LOSE ALL POINTS, AND BECOME INELIGIBLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

SAFETY:

ICSCC minimum safety standards as set forth in Section 11 of the current year ICSCC Competition Regulations shall apply. Cars that meet Vintage racing organization's standards may be accepted with proof that the car has been approved to race by those organizations.

MODIFICATIONS:

There shall be no minimum weight for the Nostalgic Series thus no need to scale after the races.

Production class cars shall fit the spirit of "Production" cars thus modifications should be similar to those allowed in ICSCC Improved Production classes (SCCA Production). Most current ICSCC classes other than most GT, SP, and ITE cars are considered within the spirit of Production cars. Cars such as the Caterham 7 and Factory Five Roadster fit into the spirit of the Nostalgic Series. Furthermore, the Cascade Competition Board reserves the right to include any car into the series they feel meets the spirit of the series.

TIRES:

Production cars shall run on DOT approved tires. Sports Racers and Formula cars may run on slicks.

DRIVER CONDUCT:

This is racing; however, car to car contact will not be tolerated. Drivers are expected to leave racing room and to be aware of their surroundings. They should avoid contact whenever possible. There is the potential for a wide disparity of speed and types of cars so situational awareness is paramount.

GRIDDING FOR RACES:

Qualifying times will be used to set the grid for race one (fastest first to slowest last). The grids for subsequent races will be set using a driver's fastest lap time from the previous race (fastest first to slowest last). See Split Starts below.

SPLIT STARTS:

Production classes and Sports Racers/Formula classes will utilize a split start for each race. The Race Steward has sole discretion over which group starts first and will take into consideration the number of cars in each of the classes as well as lap times.

OTHER: Except for what is listed above, rules and procedures will follow the current ICSCC Competition Regulations. Questions about the series, contact: racing@cascadesportscarclub.org

July 19 Saturday Series Rally



June Saturday Series Rally Results

Twelve teams entered Cascade's third of six events in the Saturday Rally Series held on June 7. Apparently, the Portland Rose Festival kept many of our "regular" rallyists away on this busy weekend.

Russ and Katy Kraushaar titled this event *Lucky #41* commemorating their forty-first rally as Rallymasters. They provided a challenging event from Milwaukie Lowe's to Ridgefield, Washington.

About the rally

This rally intentionally provided fewer official mileage (OM) references than *usual* (compared to recent Saturday Series events). Also the reference to some



checkpoints (CP) was intentionally omitted from the route instructions, so the placement of checkpoints was harder to predict. There were fewer checkpoints than the average Saturday Series event, and leg times were on average longer.

The June rally was slightly longer than the average Saturday Series Rally, with a 110-mile course that took just under three and a half hours to complete. The 35-mile one-hour odometer calibration transit went north on

Interstate 205, merged onto Interstate 5, and ended at Daybreak Park (CP3 on map).

A quick transit with a short break at the Cedar Creek Grist Mill (CP8) was followed by a longer stop at a service station/convenience store on Interstate 5 east of La Center (CP13).

The break ended with a free zone to escape the traffic of the area and continue in the rural countryside west of the freeway (CP14).


Challenges

As always, it is helpful to be familiar with Cascade's Road Rally Rules when participating in one of our

events. Like most competitions, TSD road rally is a rules-based game. This rally specifically mentioned in the Rallymasters' Notes accompanying the Rally Route Instructions, "To be most successful in this rally, it will be helpful to be familiar with Main Road Determinants (RRR 3)." That was true in spades for this event.

The June rally included four main road traps (two based on ONTO and two on Protection). Another four traps offered a deviation where there was no intersection (where one of the two route possibilities was a dead end). One trap was an OR instruction where the half of the OR to be executed was based on which half was referenced first.

All together the rally included nine instructions containing ITIS (if there is such) which means the instruction can be skipped if it cannot be executed prior to the next numbered route instruction. The Rallymaster noted that he had a friend that simply skipped all the ITIS instructions, and he said it always worked. In this rally, not all the ITIS instructions were skipped; a couple were on course and should have been executed.

In addition to the OR instruction mentioned above, there were two more OR instructions required to support the two routes that resulted from a tricky triangle protection trap. You are looking for an S first OPP and this is it! If you go straight and then just keep on going, then you have missed the back-facing stop sign on the road



leaving the triangle. The back-facing stop sign is hard to see in this photo, but when you actually drive up to it, it is plain as day. Since this triangle is actually three separate intersections, after you take the straight, the on course route immediately follows the main road to the left on the far side of the triangle. Then continues straight (the same way you would have gone if you didn't have the S first OPP). Off course teams who went straight past the back-facing stop sign took a different route, using the OR instructions, to rejoin the oncourse route a few instructions later.

And that's not all! The locations at which to execute three instructions containing speed changes were determined by a stated distance API (after previous instruction). Sounds straight forward, but sometimes it wasn't so clear. For example, when an API followed an ITIS instruction, did you execute the ITIS or skip it? Where does the API mileage start? Oh, what fun!

Although there were many challenges, none were very hurtful to your score. If executed incorrectly, most of these challenges resulted in few penalty points.

What the rallymasters said

However, we've not written one since 2018 so this event is probably a little "old school" and not exactly what you're used to of late. Personally, I prefer twisty roads, brisk speeds and confusing traps that make you think. Then you're late and get to drive fast. Hopefully you were successful and had a fun drive.

We want to especially thank a few folks for their help. We had Torm Kelsey-Green and Kasey Klaus help with the guinea pig. They provided great input and, now that I think about it, made up quite a bit of time after an off-course excursion but still got to the finish on time. My kind of ralliers!

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






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
